In recent times NBN has used the terms NTD (Network Termination Device), which then changed to NBN Connection Device. To my knowledge never abbreviated this to NCD. In fact NBN were being proactive to avoid acronyms in a bid to help consumers. Subsequently NBN has now renamed these devices yet again and are now referenced as NBN Connection Box of which they have been once again careful not to call it a NCB. Where these devices are used, the end consumer is given a user guide on their use and how to connect. FTTP, FTTC, Fixed Wireless and HFC technologies.
