Your Comments: This is relation to the use or definition of Concealed cabling. The Telecommunications (Types of Cabling Work) Declaration 2013 states "In this item, an associated customer cabling product is taken to be concealed in a building cavity if all or part of the associated customer cabling product is concealed in the wall, floor or ceiling cavity of the building." As a result of this statement in section 4.(3) the running of a pre-terminated Labeled manufactured cabling in ducting appears to be at odds with the general term of concealed. As such it could be argued based on the wording of the The Telecommunications (Types of Cabling Work) Declaration that as long as it cabling does not pass through a wall, floor or ceiling cavity it is exempt. An example of this would be that cabling run on ducting that is secured to the surface of a wall and runs around the wall can have a long pre-manufactured cable installed in it by an unsupervised non registered cabler or in the works of the draft standard "Ordinary Person".
